

## “Jesus - the Builder and Owner of God’s Household”

Hebrews 3:1-6a

February 4, 2024

*“<sup>1</sup> Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, <sup>2</sup> who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God’s house. <sup>3</sup> For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses — as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself. <sup>4</sup> (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) <sup>5</sup> Now Moses was faithful in all God’s house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, <sup>6</sup> but Christ is faithful over God’s house as a son. And we are his house...” (Hebrews 3:1-6a)*

### **I. Jesus - the Builder of God’s Household**

- A. Moses was merely faithful to God’s house; but Jesus is the Divine Creator of all things, including God’s household.

*Hebrews 1:2–3 – <sup>2</sup> through whom [Jesus] also he created the world. <sup>3</sup> He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power.*

- B. The divine nature of Christ brought God’s household into existence and now goes on sustaining it.

### **II. Jesus – the Owner of God’s Household**

- A. Faithful Moses was a mere servant of God’s household.
- B. When Christ’s human nature was given the status of God’s royal Son, He became the heir, the owner of God’s household.

### **III. Implications**

- A. Our Christian heroes and leaders are just servants in the house that *Jesus* builds and owns.
- B. Our fellow servants’ failures can’t do *real* damage to Christ’s house.
- C. We are *all* just mere servants in Christ’s house.
