<u>"Fearing and Striving for God's Rest"</u> Hebrews 4:1-11 February 18, 2024

I. The Fear that Leads to God's Rest (vs. 1-2)

A. Those who believe the gospel need not fear God's judgement.

1 *John* **4:18** - *There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love.*

B. However, we should fear God's judgment if we slip into *unbelief*.

Romans 11:20b–22 - ²⁰ ... So do not become proud, but fear. ²¹ For if God did not spare the natural branches [non-believing Jews], neither will he spare you. ²² Note then the kindness and the severity of God: severity toward those who have fallen, but God's kindness to you, provided you continue in his kindness. Otherwise, you too will be cut off.

C. We should fear our own potential waywardness and always seek the Lord's help.

II. The Nature of God's Rest (vs. 3-10)

- A. It is entered by faith alone.
- B. It is God's eternal, restful presence that awaits us on the Last Day.

III. Striving to Enter God's Rest (v. 11)

- A. We are to make every effort to keep the faith until the end.
- B. This includes being fanatically committed to the means of grace (public worship, prayer, Bible reading, etc.).
- C. It certainly includes regularly exhorting one another to not become hardened by the deceitfulness of sin (DBH!). (Heb. 3:12-13)
