## "Exposed But Still Welcome"

## Hebrews 4:12-16 February 25, 2024

## I. The Effects of God's Word (vs. 12-13)

- A. Its Objective Effects
  - 1. God's Word powerfully accomplishes all that God intends.

**Isaiah 55:11** - so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

- 2. God's Word truly exposes and definitively condemns sinners.
- B. Its Subjective Effects
  - 1. The Scriptures often reveal to *us* who we *really* are.
  - 2. This can leave us feeling distant and disowned by God.

## II. Our Welcoming High Priest (vs. 14-16)

- A. As our Priest, Jesus has already made a perfect offering for our sins (His own body and blood!).
  - **Hebrews 5:1** For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins.
- B. Having suffered like us with temptation (though without sin), Jesus remains sympathetic toward wayward and imperfect believers.
  - *Psalm* 103:14 For He Himself knows our frame; He is mindful that we are only dust.
- C. Believers can always confidently draw near to God's throne to receive mercy, grace, and help from our Eternal High Priest.
