"The Father's Superior Spokesman" Hebrews 1:1-3 November 12, 2023

The passage's main message – God's Son is His final and superior spokesman, even superior to the writers of the Old Testament.

I. Superior because of the Method of Christ's Message

- A. Prior revelation had come through various means and at different times.
- B. Christ brought the Father's singular, completed, and final message.

Jude 3 - Beloved, although I was very eager to write to you about our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints.

II. Superior because of the Timing of Christ's Message

- A. Old Testament revelation was given "long ago".
- B. Christ brough the Father's message in "these last days".
 - 1. The "last days" is a common Old Testament expression describing the culminating point in Old Testament Israel's history.
 - 2. The New Testament confirms that the "last days" had dawned (Acts 2:16-17, etc.).
 - 3. This timing pointed to the culminating and complete nature of God's revelation through Christ.

III. Superior because of the Nature of Christ

- A. Christ is not just a prophet, but God's Son.
- B. Christ in His humanity has inherited all things.
- C. The world was made through Him.

John 1:1–3 - ¹ *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.* ² *He was in the beginning with God.* ³ *All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made.*

- D. God the Son shares the glory of the Father ("the radiance of His glory").
- E. The Divine Son possesses the Father's divine nature ("the exact reflection of His nature").
- F. The God-Man holds the universe together by the power of His word.
- G. He made purification for His people' sins (unlike any mere prophet).
- H. He is seated bodily at the right hand of the Father (unlike any Old Testament writer).

IV. What does this passage say to us today?

A. We now possess God's supreme and final message in the pages of the New Testament.

John 14:26 - But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.

- B. We are reminded that the Old Testament must always now be interpreted in light of Christ.
 - **John 1:45** Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."
 - John 5:46 "For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me."
 - *Luke* 24:27 Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.
- C. No other messengers from God are coming now that Christ has.
- D. All other voices in our lives must be evaluated in light of God's final, supreme revelation given through His Son.
