"The Fall of Man" Bible Stories, Pt. 4: Genesis 2:25-3:24

I. Naked and Unashamed Prior to the Fall

- A. Humanity would not have remained naked forever (see Rev. 6:11; 7:13-14).
- B. Their nakedness is mentioned in Gen. 2:25 to foreshadow the tragic results of the fall.
- C. It also forms a literary connection between 2:25 and the Serpent of 3:1 ("naked" and "crafty" sound alike in Hebrew).

II. The Knowledge of Good and Evil Defined

- A. It's not bad in and of itself; God has it! Gen. 3:22
- B. Despite Satan's lie, God did plan to one day give it to humanity.
 - 1 Kings 3:9 "So give Your servant an understanding heart to judge Your people to discern between good and evil. For who is able to judge this great people of Yours?"
- C. The Knowledge of Good and Evil was the authority and wisdom necessary to condemn evil and remove it from God's creation.
- D. Adam and Eve, in their creation infancy, were not ready for that privilege.
 - 1. Yet they immaturely and disobediently grasped for it.
 - 2. This led to horrific results for them and their posterity.

III. The Tragic Results of the Fall

- A. Death spiritual and physical spread to all.
- B. They received a corrupted version of the knowledge of good and evil.
 - 1. This opened their eyes to their nakedness, revealing their unfit status to possess the role for which they had rebelliously grasped.
 - 2. The shame of this self-judgment caused them to blame everyone else as unrighteous judges.
 - a. Eve blamed the serpent.
 - b. Adam blamed Eve.
 - c. Adam even blamed God!
 - 3. All of this characterizes the human race today.

- a. We know enough to know something is wrong with us.
- b. We mask that shame by obsessing over the wrongs of others.

IV. Creation Cursed in Hope (Rom. 8:20)

- A. The deadly toil of this life leads the elect to look up for deliverance.
- B. The trials of marriage and family lead God's people to yearn to be identified with the true Husband and His true Bride.
- C. The fulfillment of those longings was possible because the serpent's head would one day be crushed by a self-sacrificing Son of Eve (Gen. 3:15).
- D. Amazingly, our redemption by that Son will also include being put in that position of godly authority that our first parents tried to steal ahead of time:

1 Corinthians 6:3a - Do you not know that we will judge angels?

- 1. We will not just watch Christ judge evil and expel it forever.
- 2. We, by His grace, will participate with Him in that judgment.
- 3. We will finally have full possession of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, along with the full purity heart of heart necessary to make us righteous judges.
