"Not Ashamed to be Called their God" Bible Stories, Pt. 8: Genesis 26:34-28:5

I. The Right Perspective on Jacob – Gen. 25:19-34

Genesis 25:27–28 - ²⁷ When the boys grew up, Esau became a skillful hunter, a man of the field, but Jacob was a peaceful [Heb. "tam"] man, living in tents. ²⁸ Now Isaac loved Esau, because he had a taste for game, but Rebekah loved Jacob.

- A. Not Esau the respectable man of action and Jacob the mild-mannered mama's boy.
- B. But instead Esau the irresponsible rebel and Jacob the responsible, complete man.

II. The Stealing of the Abrahamic Blessing

- A. Isaac, out of food-driven preference for Esau, was trying to secretly thwart God's choice of Jacob (Gen. 25:23).
 - 1. It's not that Isaac had no faith or regard for the Lord.
 - 2. But he had major hang-ups with how the Lord was implanting His plans.
- B. Rebekah and Jacob do appear to be more passionate about God's specific decrees than Isaac.
 - 1. This fits well with the earlier Genesis descriptions of both of them.
 - 2. But blatantly deceiving Isaac was inappropriate and would not have been necessary.
 - 3. Their trickery costs them both in major ways

III. The God of the Imperfect and Dysfunctional

Hebrews 11:16 - ... *God is not ashamed to be called their [Abraham's, Isaac's, and Jacob's) God...*
