<u>"Preservation by Persevering"</u> Short and Sweet, Pt. 4 - Jude 1-3, 20-24 July 21, 2019

I. Introduction to the Epistle of Jude

A. Jude was Christ's half-brother.

Matthew 13:55–56 - ⁵⁵ Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary? And are not his brothers James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? ⁵⁶ And are not all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all these things?"

B. Jude wrote about 65 AD, to a largely Jewish-Christian audience.

II. The Structural Messages of Jude

Promise of God's preservation (vs. 1-2)

Warning to persevere (v. 3)

Reason for the warning (vs. 4-19)

Warning to persevere (vs. 20-23)

Promise of God's preservation (vs. 24-25)

A. Jude opens and closes with promises of God's keeping believers in a state of salvation.

*John 10:27–29-*²⁷ "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me; ²⁸ and I give eternal life to them, and they will never perish; and no one will snatch them out of My hand. ²⁹ "My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand.

John 6:39–40 - ³⁹ "This is the will of Him who sent Me, that of all that He has given Me I lose nothing, but raise it up on the last day. ⁴⁰ "For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who beholds the Son and believes in Him will have eternal life, and I Myself will raise him up on the last day."

B. Just after and just before those promises of preservation, Jude exhorts his readers to persevere in the faith.

1 Timothy 6:12 - Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called, and you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

C. Why did Jude's readers need to persevere? A dangerous false teaching was present.

III. Are we preserved by God or must we persevere on our own?

A. Our salvation is ultimately and finally dependent upon God, not us.

1 Thessalonians 5:23–24 - ²³ Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be preserved complete, without blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. ²⁴ Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass.

B. Yet God preserves us through the Holy Spirit's moving us to heed the warnings and exhortations of Scripture.

Philippians 2:12b–13 - ¹² ... work out your salvation with fear and trembling; ¹³ for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure.

- C. What does "keeping ourselves in God's love" look like (Jude 20-21)?
 - 1. Not constant fear.
 - 2. Not smug self-confidence and laziness.
 - 3. Rather, it's consistent Bible study, prayer, and developing an eternal, heavenly perspective on the here and now.
 - 4. A person who's consistent in those areas is someone that God is clearly preserving.
